Tips for Meeting with Your Legislator

Get to know your legislator. Review your legislator's biography, committee assignments, and legislative priorities.

Gather the facts to show that your advocacy goal is relevant. Before you set the agenda for the meeting, gather the facts you need to build a compelling case that will move your legislator to take action.

Use good etiquette. Introduce yourself and mention whether you are a constituent of the legislator.

Prepare a brief pitch. After thanking the legislator for meeting with you, state clearly and concisely the issue that you want to discuss, the scale of the problem, your position and your personal connection to the issue, and the action you want the legislator to take.

Be clear. After you make your pitch, allow the legislator to respond. Ask a direct question to which the legislator can respond "yes." Such as, "Can we count on you to support our efforts on sentencing reform?"

Wrap up the meeting well. Always thank the legislator or staffer for their time at the end of the meeting, even if they did not agree with your position.

Follow up. Always follow up with an email thanking the legislator or staffer for the meeting, reiterating your key points and any commitments the legislator made with you. Include all follow-up information you promised to provide.




